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What is the Non-DoD School Program?

The **Non-DoD school program (NDSP)** is in place to help maintain the continuity of education for children when families are stationed at international locations where DoDEA schools are not available. The goal of the NDSP is to help with the cost of education in international locations as well as support for making the transition back to education in the United States as seamless as possible.

The NDSP helps cover costs that would not normally be expenses for families in the states such as fees for tuition and enrollment, textbooks and transportation. These expenses that are covered by the NDSP are known as **allowable expenses**. Any expenses that will be the responsibility of the families are known as **non-allowable expenses**. These are expenses that would be covered by the parents if their children were attending school in the United States or at a Department of Defense Education Activities (DoDEA) school. These non-allowable expenses would include fees for meals, camps, field trips and uniforms amongst others.

The **NDSP does not endorse any specific school**. Families have the opportunity to choose any school that they would like to send their children to based on the needs of their children. This gives families the chance to send their children to international schools that utilize varying curriculums and offer a number of extra-curricular activities and programs.

All families will be allotted an education allowance to send their children to the international school of their choosing. Any fees, regardless of whether or not they are allowable or non-allowable expenses that exceed that annual education allowance will be the financial responsibility of the parents. Payment arrangements for any fees in excess of the education allowance will be arranged between the families and the schools.

All parents must take the **NDSP online orientation** prior to registering with the NDSP. After registering with the NDSP and receiving confirmation for the funds that you have been authorized, families can enroll at the international school of their choice.

American Common Core State Standards

Common Core will probably be recognized by most Americans. These standards were developed as a means to break the stagnant increase in performance levels of children in the United States. These standards outline what children should know by the end of each grade level in Mathematics & Language Arts/Literacy.

Alberta Curriculum

A Canadian based curriculum in which, according to the Program for International Student Assessment (PISA), is said to be one of the best education curriculums for children. The Alberta curriculum was developed with the whole child in mind. Educators work to educate children based on their individual levels rather than requiring all of the children in the class to perform on the same level. This approach allows children to learn at their own pace.

Curriculum Guide and Education Standards

International Baccalaureate

The International Baccalaureate Program (IB) was developed to help children become lifetime learners, who are able to think critically and independently. This curriculum has been in use for the last fifty years in more than 150 countries. The IB Program is comprised of four programs:

- Primary Years Program (PYP) for Kindergarten-5th Grade
- Middle Years Program (MYP) for grades 6th-10th
- Diploma Program (DP) for grades 11th-12th
- Career Related Program (CP) for students ages 16-19.

Three of the four programs PYP, MYP and DP are currently offered in the international schools.

Fieldwork Education's International Curriculum

This international curriculum is comprised of three programs:

- International Early Years Curriculum (IEYC)
- International Primary Curriculum (IPC)
- International Middle Years Curriculum (IMYC)

The curriculums are all designed around eight learning principles that are essential to children's learning, growth and development. Each of the curriculums features learning units that aim to capture children's interest by teaching them subjects in a way that exhibits the interdisciplinary and holistic nature of subjects.

Cambridge international Curriculum

The Cambridge International Curriculum uses a learner-centered, inquiry-based approach to learning and presents students with a broad range of subjects. One of the goals of this curriculum is develop students' skills in problem solving, creative thinking and inquiry and also strives to help students transition into advanced studies. Schools have the ability to structure the curriculum based on the specific needs of their students as there are 70 subjects in 30 different languages offered.

The Olson School

The Olson School is a unique, small school for children 3 years to Grade 1. Students learn in an enriching, educational environment where subjects are studied to gain mastery and depth of knowledge. With an eye toward the student's eventual return to the US, Olson has incorporated the US common core standards into its curriculum and most students test well above grade level. These results are more a testament of small class size (5-6 students) where discussion, study and working together to learn in a stimulating environment surpass the need for continual testing.



Core classes include: STEM, STMATH, Korean, Geography/Social Studies and Language Arts.

The after school classes consist of a brand new sports school with dedicated, fun coaches and skilled art teachers. Students attend these classes 2-3 times a week. Other extracurricular activities are swimming (open and lessons), Tai Kwon Do, Hap Ki Do, and music to mention a few.

will **complete the process in Spring 2020.** This is significant as it means that the graduation certificates of BIA's first graduating class will be WASC-validated.

BIA is a **member of the SKAC Conference**, ensuring that our students participate fully in sporting competitions taking place across the southern half of South Korea. In addition to the SKAC focus on volleyball, basketball and track & field, our students also enjoy soccer, handball, ultimate frisbee, floorball, dodgeball, multi-sports, hiking and other activities during PE lessons, at break times, and as after-school outdoor clubs, while a number of indoor clubs are offered as well.

Multi-Age Learning

In **2019-2020**, **BIA classes** will open from **Pre-K right through to Grade 10**. Classes will combine twoyear groups, as shown below. At BIA, multi-age classes are not only practical, due to the small size, but BIA has found that they also have a very positive impact on learning across all ages. Multi-age learning is sometimes a concern for new parents, who may assume that it is less effective than single entry classes. However, important educational research has identified several key strengths in multi-age classes, showing why this is often a preferred approach. As BIA grows, there may be a need to transition to single age groups, but in the shorter term BIA is achieving remarkable levels of learning with a dynamic, multi-age approach, supported by high levels of individual teacher attention.






